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Short Description of IPSE Programme: The Certificate in Social Citizenship is a one-year course. Classes take place 3 days per week from September to April, followed by a 3-month work



placement. Students develop skills to promote self-reliance and independence.

The course is underpinned by a rights-based agenda, and provides opportunities for co-learning between students with and without disabilities, for mutual benefit. This promotes awareness raising and reciprocal learning.

### Detailed Description of Programme: What Is The Certificate in Social Citizenship (CSC)?

The Certificate in Social Citizenship (CSC) is a two-year part-time programme. Students develop skills to promote increased self-reliance and independence. This allows them to become more involved in all aspects of life.

The programme is underpinned by the values of respect, recognition of diversity and inclusivity, and is informed by a rights-based agenda.

The course provides opportunities for interaction between CSC students and students on other university programmes. This creates spaces for awareness-raising and reciprocal learning, enriches the university as a whole, and enhances campus and community engagement.

## 1. Core Modules

These modules are taken only with other students from the Certificate in Social Citizenship only.

# 2. Co-Learning Modules

These modules are taken with students from other courses around the university.

- The World Around Us

## 3. Work Placement

Students spend 3 months on a paid placement doing work experience.
